Vote Numbers Coincide w/2019 General Assembly Scorecards for Regular Session

<p>HB 2007: Pro-Life Protections included in the Department of Economic Development Appropriations Bill to prevent public funding for life sciences research projects which would have included abortion services, human cloning, embryonic stem cell research and fetal research without these protections. <i>(Final Status: Passed with Pro-Life Protections)</i></p>
<p>Votes Counted in Regards to HB 2007:</p>
<p>House Votes: Pro-Life Protections placed on HB 2007. MRL neutral with pro-life protections on the bill.</p>
<p>Senate Votes: Pro-Life Protections placed on HB 2007. The Senate Appropriations Committee maintained the Pro-Life Protections on HB 2007 and MRL remained neutral.</p>
<p>HB 2010: Department of Health and Human Services Appropriations Bill. Includes Pro-Life Protective Language to the Director of the Department that no public monies can be used for abortion services or abortion referrals. Also includes language to Prevent Expansion of Medicaid through Obamacare. <i>(Final Status: Passed with Pro-Life Protections)</i></p>
<p>Votes Counted in Regards to HB 2010:</p>
<p>House Votes: Numbers – 19, 21, 23, 28, 29, 30</p>
<p>Senate Votes: Numbers – 10, 12, 16, 17, 18</p>
<p>HB 2011: Department of Social Services Appropriations Bill that gives \$8,958,561 to the Alternatives to Abortion Program and \$32,595,141 to the Show Me Healthy Babies Program and \$1,398,993 to a new pilot program to help Pregnant and Post-Partum Moms to get help to overcome addiction to opioids. Missouri Right to Life strongly supports these programs and funding. The legislature also redirects the funding of federal Medicaid family planning dollars from Planned Parenthood to Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC’s). Included in this year’s bill is pro-life protective language to the Director of the Department that no public monies can be used for abortion services or abortion referrals and to Prevent Expansion of Medicaid through Obamacare. <i>(Final Status: Passed with Funding for Pro-Life Programs and Pro-Life Protective Language)</i></p>
<p>Votes Counted in Regards to HB 2011:</p>
<p>House Votes: Numbers – 20, 24, 31, 32, 33</p>
<p>Senate Votes: Numbers – 11, 13, 19, 20, 21</p>

HB 126: Omnibus Pro-Life Bill that includes: ban on abortion at 8 weeks, 14 weeks & 18 weeks when a heartbeat is detected in baby; ban on abortion at 20 weeks when a baby feels pain; ban on abortion based solely on race, sex and a Down Syndrome diagnosis; ban on abortion when Roe vs. Wade is overturned; requirement that abortion or family planning facilities referring a woman to an out-of-state abortion facility give that woman Missouri's printed informed consent information; two custodial parent notification prior to a minor girl having an abortion; requires an increase in the malpractice insurance for those performing or inducing abortion bringing it in line with medical standards; an increase in PRC tax credits to 70% of the donation and removes the state limit on tax credits for PRC's.

(Final Status: Truly Agreed and Finally Passed)

HB 127 & SB 106: Two Custodial Parent Notification Prior to a Minor Girl Having an Abortion.

(Final Status: Truly Agreed and Finally Passed as Part of HB 126)

Votes Counted in Regards to HB 127 & SB 106:

House Votes: Numbers – 2, 4

Senate Votes: Number – 1

HB 138 & SB 406: "Simon's Law" which would prevent a physician from putting a do not resuscitate order in a minor child's medical file without parents knowledge.

(Final Status: Truly Agreed and Finally Passed)

Votes Counted in Regards to HB 138 & SB 406:

House Votes: Numbers – 1, 3, 9, 27, 34, 35

Senate Votes: Numbers – 7, 8, 15

HB 282 & SB 420: Present women referred to out-of-state abortion facility the same informed consent information offered to other women.

(Final Status: Truly Agreed and Finally Passed as Part of HB 126)

Votes Counted in Regards to HB 282 & SB 420:

House Votes: Numbers – 18, 22

Senate Votes: Number – 9

HB 680 & 339 and SB's 279, 139 & 345: "Pain Capable Unborn Child Protection Act" would ban abortions when baby can feel pain.

(Final Status: Truly Agreed and Finally Passed as Part of HB 126)

Votes Counted in Regards to HB 680 & 339 and SB's 279, 139 & 345:

House Votes: Numbers – 5, 8

Senate Votes: Number – 3

HB 971 & SB 388: "Abortion Survivor's Protection Act" would protect babies from being killed after birth.

(Final Status: Failed to Pass)

Votes Counted in Regards to HB 971 & SB 388:

House Votes: Numbers – 25, 26

Senate Votes: Number – 4

SB 287: Allows Enrollment of Pregnant Women in Health Benefit Plan after Becoming Pregnant.

(Final Status: Failed to Pass)

SB 312: Establishes & Expands Mission Statement of the MO Department of Health to Include the Care of both Born and Unborn MO Citizens.
