
President Trump has given Governor Mike

# Late-term abortionist LeRoy Carhart's soothing description of aborting huge unborn babies in 2nd and 3rd trimesters

Tip of the cap to Micaiah Bilger for providing pro-lifers with another reminder of the notorious — and I do mean notorious — late term abortionist, LeRoy Carhart.

Veteran pro-lifers recall that Carhart was at the heart of two abortion cases that reached the Supreme Court: Stenberg v. Carhart, in which the Supreme Court overturned a Nebraska ban on partial-birth abortions, and Gonzales v. Carhart, in which the Supreme Court upheld the federal ban on partial-birth abortions.

Carhart fled Nebraska for Germantown, Maryland (and subsequently Bethesda, Maryland) which has infinitely less protective laws and set up his grisly trade in which he aborts unborn babies up to and well beyond 28 weeks.

Bilger went to Carhart's webpage and what she found was shocking, even by Carhart's standards.

The brochure informs the woman (or perhaps the abortionist who is looking for someone who will abort a baby well into the third trimester) that at and after 28 weeks, killing the baby ["an induction abortion"] takes place "over a four day period." Here's the explanatory paragraph:

This process generally starts with a medication [poison] that is given by a needle, through the abdomen, into the pregnancy. This is done to stop the heart of the fetus and end the pregnancy. Then your cervix is numbed and dilated using mechanical dilators, and laminaria. The laminaria are placed into your cervix and left there to expand slowly overnight. This laminaria process will be repeated each day. On the final day of the abortion, the doctor

will give you medicine called Misoprostol over the course of a few hours to soften and dilate your cervix more. All of these steps combined will induce labor of a typically intact stillborn.

As part of "Caring for women with kindness, courtesy, justice, love & respect," Carhart remarks that "Many patients request a remembrance of their baby to take home with them."

Every time I read about Carhart, I ask myself is he more bent on fooling women or deluding himself?

We're frequently told that Carhart is one of a mere handful of abortionists willing to take the lives of babies late into the third trimester. Thank goodness they are few and far between.

Well, on second thought, perhaps not so shocking. When pressed by a British journalist how late he would perform abortions, Carhart said he was not comfortable saying but added: "To the fetus it makes no difference whether it's born or not born."

He told a stunned [Hilary] Andersson: "The baby has no input in this as far as I'm concerned."

The presenter [Andersson] commented on his use of the word 'baby', which she pointed out is uncommon for abortionists, as "they'll use the word 'fetus' because they don't want to acknowledge that there's a life".

She asked: "And you don't have a problem with killing a baby?"

Dr. Carhart responded: "Absolutely not. I have no problem if it's in the mother's uterus."

Illinois Police Find Thousands Of Aborted Baby Remains At Abortionist's Home

Will County, Illinois authorities are reporting that they have found thousands of preserved fetal remains in the home of deceased abortionist Ulrich Klopfer.

CBS 2 reports, "More than 2,200 medically preserved fetal remains were found

by a family after the death of a well-known abortion doctor last week, the Will County Sheriff's Office confirmed Friday night. The Will County Coroner's Office was called to the property by a family attorney after Dr. Ulrich Klopfer died on Sept. 3. The attorney said the family found what appeared to be fetal remains while going through the doctor's personal property and requested proper removal. Investigators found and took possession of 2,246 medically preserved fetal remains at the location in unincorporated Will County."

Perhaps foreshadowing the discovery, an Indiana state inspection of Klopfer's abortion mill cited him for failure, "to ensure that the results of pathological examinations performed were included on 672 Terminated Pregnancy Reports submitted to ISDH," according to Check-MyClinic.org.

Planned Parenthood and NARAL, it should be noted, fought Indiana's fetal burial law, which would have prevented this.

Klopfer is the poster child for abortionists, abusing women, and failing to report sexual abuse.

The *South Bend Tribune* reported in 2016, "He spoke of a 10-year-old girl raped by her uncle who he performed an abortion on in an Illinois hospital but didn't notify police about the child abuse. Instead, he let her go home with her parents, who knew of the rape and refused to prosecute. ...Klopfer, 71, is likely Indiana's most prolific abortion doctor in history with numbers going into the tens of thousands of procedures in multiple counties over several decades. Testimony during Thursday's hearing – which ended this morning - showed a man who was essentially using the same abortion and sedation procedures from the 1970s and 1980s."

Echoing the talking points of today's abortion supporters, Klopfer, who failed to report the rape of a 10-year-old girl to the police, is quoted as saying, "Women get pregnant, men don't. We need to respect women making a decision that they think is best in their life ... I'm not here to dictate to anybody. I'm not here to judge anybody."

Kermit Gosnell would be proud.

#### Men's abortion regret: "I've thought about it every day for 32 years."

For most people, abortion is seen strictly as a women's issue. But while women can suffer grief and trauma from abortion, men can as well — yet their voices are often left out of the conversation. How does abortion affect fathers? A BBC article sought to examine just that.

Calling it "The men who feel left out of US abortion debate," the BBC interviewed several men whose children died in abortion. For them, it was a horrible experience that changed them forever. "I was in my 30s living the good single life in Dallas," Karl Locker recounted. When he found out a girlfriend of his was pregnant, he said he felt like "one of those wolves with its leg caught in a trap." Still, he said he tried to do the right thing. "I tried everything, I offered to marry her, to take the baby myself, or to offer it up for adoption," he said. "She said she could never give her child up for adoption – it didn't make cognitive sense."

Though Locker gave her his support, driving her to the abortion facility, the knowledge of what he had done haunted him. "I didn't know how I was going to survive; I wasn't going to jump off a bridge, but I probably would have drank myself to death," he said. "I've thought about what happened every day for the last 32 years."

Chuck Raymond said his girlfriend had an abortion in the 1970s when she was 18. "Men are meant to be protectors, so there is a sense of failure – failing to protect



the mother and the unborn child, failing to be responsible," he said. "There is incredible guilt and shame about having not done that." Originally, he had felt a pregnancy would interfere with his plans to attend West Point military academy, which does not allow cadets who are married or raising children. But the trauma eventually resurfaced. "Once I was involved in training, I got caught up in everything and suppressed the event, keeping it out of my

consciousness. Years later though, I realized that a tragedy had occurred, and we had made a tragic choice," he explained, comparing it to post-traumatic stress disorder

34-year-old Theo Purington said his girlfriend had an abortion against his wishes, leaving him "depressed."

"People don't see it, they keep men out of it," he told the BBC. "If men had to sign off on an abortion, I think you would see a 50% drop, and that's why the [abortion providers] don't want men involved. The greatest injustice in this country today is that a man cannot protect his unborn child from abortion [in the same way as] men protecting our children is part of our responsibility."

Kevin Burke, who helps organize post-abortion retreats for Rachel's Vineyard, says the silence helps prevent healing. "Because of the rhetoric out there, people can't address what is there, which is a sense of loss, and affects men and women whether you went into it pro-choice or not. But you are not given permission to speak about any of that, so you can't process it," he explained. "The abortion experience for men, especially with previous father loss, abuse and trauma, can contribute to the other issues that can lead men to express their grief, loss and rage from childhood abuse, and their abortion experiences, in destructive ways. What we have learned is they seem to interact in a kind of toxic synergy."

Men have begun speaking out more frequently about the loss and grief they feel after abortion. While abortion is always a death sentence for a preborn child, it doesn't deliver the freedom parents believe it will give them. Instead, it chains them to a lifetime of pain and regret.

#### Missouri Stands for the Unborn Act Could Challenge Roe v Wade

Could Missouri's new pro-life law test the 1973 SCOTUS decision?

A recent article by Clyde Hughes of UPI discussed the possibility of the numerous new state abortion restrictions across the country taking the issue back to the U.S. Supreme Court.

In the article, he notes a comment by Chuck Donovan, President of the pro-life Charlotte Lozier Institute. Donovan said Missouri's new law, the Missouri Stands for the Unborn Act (HB126), could well be the law that challenges Roe v Wade -- could be that one that pro-life people have been awaiting.

Donovan said, "[It] is an interesting law because it's a smorgasbord of proposals, including one that outlaws abortion when the baby can feel pain at the 20 week's gestation stage. That's a provision that has about 70 percent public support."

He continued, "[The ban] dovetails into the stage of pregnancy where more babies are being treated in the womb either surgically, or around that time they can survive outside the womb. These are scientific medical facts that did not exist at the time of Roe v Wade."

Let us pray and hope, through the grace of God, that he is correct.

#### Alert ~

A group called "Healthcare for Missouri" has filed a petition and will be collecting signatures to expand Medicaid in Missouri. MRL's position in the legislature opposes Medicaid expansion because it will increase the number of abortions -- and be paid for with public tax dollars.

Does it seem to you as if the world is going a bit crazy?

Everyone talks about civility and how words matter, but it seems as if few listen. Everyone thinks someone else is responsible for the disparaging rhetoric and hostile attitudes too often evident in our public discourse.

Perhaps at this moment in history, pro-lifers can be a light to the country. We've been on the receiving end of an endless stream of disparaging remarks for decades (check your local news outlets) yet refuse to return in kind.

Why?

Why would we return kind for kind when we respect the lives of all human beings, beginning with the little ones who have no voice, and extending to their mothers?

Proof?

We open our arms and our hearts to those women who have had an abortion, even though we fervently wish their decision had been for life. They need healing, even when — especially when — they don't know it.

We pray for those in the abortion industry, along with political leaders who support those in the business of taking the lives of preborn children. Is it an accident that Planned Parenthood, the worst offender of them all, is in self-inflicted turmoil?

I think not.

Certainly, we are angered by the cheapening of human life. It is difficult to fathom the callousness that allows some abortion proponents to suggest that killing an unborn child is no more momentous than having a tooth pulled or an appendix removed.

But we redirect that anger into productive channels — into education and political action. The governors and state legislators who are so rabidly pro-abortion that they pass laws to remove any protection from unborn children up to, and even after birth,

need to hear from us. And they do!

We publicize the truth that almost all Democratic members of the U.S. House of Representatives, under the leadership of Nancy Pelosi, refuse to sign a discharge petition that would allow the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act to be brought to the floor of the House for a vote.

Their excuses for not signing ring hollow. No matter how often they say otherwise, babies do survive abortions. Requiring nothing more than treatment equal to what any other baby of a similar gestational age receives is justice.

As Sen. Ben Sasse said, "Everyone in the Senate ought to be able to say unequivocally that killing that little baby is wrong. This doesn't take any political courage, and if you can't say that, if there is a member in this body who can't say that, there may be lots of work you can do in the world, but you shouldn't be here."

I would say to opponents, "Open your eyes and your hearts. How can you be so cold-hearted?"

Perhaps at this moment in history, pro-lifers can be a light to the country. We've been on the receiving end of an endless stream of disparaging remarks for decades ... yet refuse to return in kind.

Let me close with this.

We work to educate fellow Americans about the tragedy that is each life lost to abortion and the remorse felt by many women who wish they had made a different choice — for life.

We work to elect pro-life men and women who will use their votes to speak up for the more than 926,000 powerless preborn babies who will die this year.

We work to pass laws to the extent possible, presenting opportunities for courts to begin unraveling Roe v Wade. Each bill, even those that do not pass, fractures Roe's crumbling foundation.

We work to help women facing a crisis pregnancy. So often lacking support, they rush to Planned Parenthood without ever exploring the help that is available in this difficult time. We want

them to know there is a better way.

Pro-lifers are frequently and unfairly accused of not caring about the mother and child after birth. This has never been the case and surely not today with



the expansion of women-helping centers around the country. These champions help young moms learn how to be better parents, how to get jobs, and how to bring order to their oft-times chaotic

personal lives. Some offer classes to fathers -- including those in prison -- so they know how to be better fathers.

I know pro-lifers who take in foster children and who adopt children -- including those with special needs. I know pro-lifers who feed the

hungry and open their homes to pregnant women. I know pro-life people who donate their time to help young children improve their reading ability and who visit sick children in hospitals.

Pro-lifers exhibit positive attitudes and exemplary attributes. They work to make life better for those around them. Being pro-life is a lifestyle. In short, pro-lifers epitomize the best of America.

America can and should be a shining city on a hill, a place where human life is respected and protected.

Within that city, it is pro-lifers who shine the light of life.

On September 10, Republicans in the U.S. House held a minority hearing on the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, a bill that would protect babies who survive abortions.
