

Remembering Dr. Jerome Lejeune: "Truly, a voice for the Voiceless"

Editor's note. This comes to us from David G. Lejeune, the President of the Jerome Lejeune Foundation USA.

Today (Apr 3, 2020) marks the anniversary of Dr. Jerome Lejeune's passing 26 years ago. The namesake of the Jerome Lejeune Foundation, Dr. Lejeune was a French geneticist who discovered the cause of Down syndrome in 1958 – a third chromosome on the 21st set of genes.

As I pause today to remember Dr. Lejeune, I'd like to take a moment to share about his life and legacy. I also ask that you keep his wife Birthe, who is a dear friend of mine, in your prayers as she battles a serious illness.

Dr. Lejeune wasn't just distinguished by his extraordinary medical discoveries – he also catalyzed a seismic shift in societal attitudes about Down syndrome. Before his discovery, many people believed that Down syndrome was the fault of the parents. Having a child with Down syndrome was considered shameful, and most people with Down syndrome were institutionalized and failed to receive the medical care they needed.

Dr. Lejeune was an outspoken advocate for these individuals, both inside and outside the womb. His scientific discoveries made it unequivocally evident to him that "life has a very long history, but each of us has a very definite beginning – the moment of conception." He truly was a voice for the voiceless!

During his lifetime, thousands of families from around the world came to him for help. He affirmed parents' love for their children with Down syndrome and demonstrated that he truly cared for each of "these dear little ones." He authentically lived out his favorite saying, which is near and dear to my heart: "Every patient is my brother."

Democrat Party Kicks Out 26-Year Legislator Because He's Pro-Life

When Democrats say there's no room for pro-life people in the Democrat party, they really mean it. And Democrats in the state of Tennessee

literally just removed a 26-year state legislator from the August primary ballot because he's pro-life.

The Tennessee Democratic Party voted to remove State Rep. John DeBerry from the August 6th primary ballot. He can no longer represent the party before voters because he doesn't stand for the "value" of killing babies in abortions. The vote wasn't even close as the radical abortion activists who run the Democrat Party voted 41-18 to kick him out.

As the *Tennessean* reports:

Tennessee Democratic Party chair Mary Mancini said it was standard procedure for the State Democratic Primary Board to vote on challenges to candidates appearing on the ballot.

"After a long meeting in which we heard challenges and evidence, we did what we thought was best to protect the Tennessee Democratic Party and the values we stand for," Mancini said.

The former Democrat didn't mince words in a statement issued after the vote.

"The Tennessee Democratic Party has decided that a 26-year Representative that spent 12 years as a committee chairman, conducted himself with integrity, served the party well, sponsored meaningful legislation, and built bridges across the aisle to get bills passed is no longer a Democrat. And so, I'm not," he said.

When it came to abortion, DeBerry had a very clear pro-life position and said people need to take more "personal responsibility" for their actions instead of getting elective abortions. And he voted for the heartbeat bill banning abortions on babies whose hearts have begun to beat.

"This was the first chance in 25 years that I had to go on record and say I disagree with abortion," said DeBerry, D-Memphis.

"I choose my battles, and I choose to give girls self esteem, self worth, to where they don't feel that their bodies are just a vessel for somebody to play with, and they don't get themselves in that position," DeBerry said.

"I think that's what's being lost. Personal responsibility, pride, self esteem — it makes

a person walk away from those situations that get them in this position. Because the woman ultimately has to bear the burden," he said. "The man walks away. The woman has to deal with it for the next nine months."

DeBerry, an ordained Church of Christ minister, said he has "stood against abortion consistently" since the 1970s.

Deberry can continue speaking out against abortion, but he will have to do so without being a Democrat.

# US Department of Health and Human Services will uphold human rights in relation to health care resource allocation.

The US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) issued a bulletin on March 28 concerning the provision of healthcare during the Covid-19 crisis.

Disability rights groups, and others, challenged the health-care orders that have been issued by several states, including Alabama and Washington State, denying human rights and equality of people with disabilities, if healthcare rationing is deemed necessary during the Covid-19 crisis....

Sheri Fink, writing for the New York Times, wrote an excellent article on the HHS bulletin and the healthcare protocols that led to complaints by the disability community. Fink quotes Roger Severino, the director of the HHS office responding to the release of the bulletin, as stating:

"Our civil rights laws protect the equal dignity of every human life from ruthless utilitarianism,".. "Persons with disabilities, with limited English skills and older persons should not be put at the end of the line for health care during emergencies."

Fink writes that Severino was responding to several complaints. She states:

Mr. Severino said in an interview that in response to multiple complaints, his office was opening the investigations to ensure that state-mandated rationing plans "are fully compliant with civil rights law." He said his office had heard from "a broad spectrum of civil rights groups, pro-life groups, disability rights groups, from prominent members of Congress from both sides of the aisle, from ordinary people who are concerned about their civil rights in this time of crisis.

Ari Ne'eman, a disability rights scholar commented on the HHS bulletin. Ne'eman states that there was "urgent need for comprehensive guidance." Fink quotes Ne'eman as stating, "Some (state) plans instruct hospitals not to offer mechanical ventilators to people above a certain age or with particular health conditions."

In Alabama's plan, people with "severe or profound mental retardation" as well as "moderate to severe dementia" should be considered "unlikely candidates for ventilator support" during a period of rationing. Washington's guidance recommends that triage teams consider transferring hospital patients with "loss of reserves in energy, physical ability, cognition and general health" to outpatient or palliative care.

In defense of the Washington State rationing plan, Fink quotes Dr Kathy Lofy, the health officer of Washington State:

"The guidance in Washington around managing scarce resources during emergencies was largely designed to avoid discrimination during the allocation of scarce resources and involves a regional team to ensure resources are being allocated in a fair way,"

The Alabama Health Department is quoted by Fink as stating:

The state's ventilator triage guidelines had been "greatly misunderstood" and were "solely intended as a tool for providers" making difficult choices. The statement said the document, which remained on its website on Saturday, was over a decade old and had since been replaced by a more comprehensive set of guidelines for health care emergencies. Those newer guidelines did not address ventilator triage, but said that the allocation of care should not be discriminatory.

Fink explains that disability rights groups were concerned because people who required long-term use of a ventilator might have been removed from the ventilator based on these state protocols. She writes that the plans typically include protocols for removing ventilators from people after a certain time period if they do not appear to be improving. In some states, including New York, people who required ventilators long-term, such as those who have certain spinal cord injuries, could be subject to having their ventilators reassigned under the protocol if they were admitted to hospitals during the crisis.

Many of the plans, even if they do not include outright age restrictions, consider stage of life as a factor in assigning ventilators or critical care beds. The civil rights office's new statement might put that into question.

Fink quotes Severino, who assures Americans that human rights laws will be upheld during the Covid-19 crisis.


If the country reached a point where health care rationing standards would be applied, "those standards must comply with civil rights laws."

"Ultimately the question as to resource allocation is not a scientific or medical one," "It is ultimately a moral and legal one."

Ne'amen is quoted as stating, "enforcement of our civil rights laws should never be called into question, even in the context of an emergency."

Fink ends her article with a promise from Severino, "I want to make sure in this time of crisis, we don't forget the foundational principles that are part of what makes America so special, that we do care for everybody, that every person in America deserves equal dignity and respect." He continued, "Our response will be a reflection of our national character."

Even in a crisis, human rights and equality must be maintained.

Prior to the tornado hitting Jefferson City and before the Corona virus of 2020, we passed in 2019 and 2017, the most pro-life bills in the United States that are protecting women, babies, and

families. These significant pieces of legislation, HB 126 of 2019 and SB 5 of 2017, were made for an unprecedented time in the history of the United States as well as the world.
