CONGRESSIONAL MAP UPDATE

The map has not been completed. House and Senate deciding on whether to go to conference while working on other versions of the map. Continue to pray for all our Representatives and Senators.

PRO-LIFE LEGISLATION FOR THE WEEK

The House perfected an omnibus pro-life bill this week. Below are the actions and outcome of the House debate regarding HCS HB 2012 and the amendments that made it and the amendment that did not. HCS HB 2012 is a very good pro-life bill and should be sent to the Senate soon.

- 1. HCS HB 2012 (Sponsored by Hannah Kelly) Underlying bill expanded on the protections to prevent baby body parts from being shipped out of state. HB 2012 also prevented the hoarding of baby body parts, preventing them from being kept on shelves after an abortion.
- HB 1854 (Sponsored by Nick Schroer) was amended on to HB 2012 Defunding of Planned Parenthood. This is important because of the Biden administration attempting at every turn to get rid of the Hyde Amendment.
- 3. HB's 1593 & 1959 (Sponsored by Sara Walsh and Doug Richey) was amended on to HB 2012 "Born Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act" giving care to babies born alive after an abortion.
- 4. Amendment by Adam Schnelting for prosecution of criminal conduct for anyone committing the crime of rape or incest resulting in pregnancy.
- <u>Amendment NOT making it on HB 2012</u> because of layers of amendments by other Republicans, the language of the Texas style bill banning abortion was not put on HB 2012. This amendment also included other provisions included in the other amendments that were adopted. The sponsor of this language is Mary Elizabeth Coleman.
- 6. HB 2810 (Sponsored by Brian Seitz) was amended on to HB 2012 Regulating abortioninducing drugs shipped into Missouri residents without an in-person consultation with a physician. Penalties for companies that put women at risk, allows for people to sue the companies and for the Missouri Attorney General to prosecute the companies breaking Missouri laws. This language prevents the "trafficking of abortion-inducing drugs".

NOTE: After a vote in House Fiscal Review Committee and the 3rd read vote & passage by the House, HCS HB 2012 as amended will go to the Senate.
